Cambridge Walking Tracks

Explore our greenbelt and walking tracks throughout Cambridge, including oak and maple arboretums. Pick up maps from Cambridge i-SITE.

Cambridge Farmer's Market

Every Saturday from 8am - 12pm on Victoria Square near the Clock Tower. Locally grown and made produce - fruit and vege, muesli, honey, butter, milk, bread and more.

Heritage Walks

Discover the historic and cultural sites of Cambridge walking the heritage trails. Guides freely available at the i-SITE Visitor Centre or download the Cambridge Museum App.

Maungakawa Scenic Reserve

15 minutes drive from the Town Centre with great views, picnic spots and a 30 minute loop walk through the regenerating bushland.

Cambridge Museum

Learn more about the History of Cambridge. Located in the Town Centre. Open Monday-Friday 10am-4pm. Saturday and Sunday 10am-2pm. 24 Victoria Street. Based in the beautiful old courthouse building.



Te Awa Cycle trail and the Avantidrome

Walk or Cycle Te Awa Cycleway to the Avantidrome, watch Cyclists train. Children can practice their cycling skills on the Gallagher Park Pump track or at the playground.

Lake Te Koo Utu

Situated on the edge of the Town Centre, Lake Te Koo Utu offers views from the platform and short walks through Native and European trees, around the lake. Particularly spectacular at spring blossom time.



Art Trail

The Cambridge Art Trail offers the opportunity to view a range of wonderful art. Take your time to walk and drive around the Galleries in the area. A map and details are available from the Cambridge i-SITE.

Public Library

Read the papers, magazines, books or set up in the children area. They also organise interesting public community events during the year and school holiday programmes. 23 Wilson Street, central Cambridge.

Children's Playgrounds

Cambridge's play areas and recreational reserves, on both sides of the river, provide ample space to relax. Miniature train rides offered most Sundays - ask us.

Lake Karapiro

The last of the hydrodams on the Waikato River. The lake has hosted many world champion watersports and is home to NZ Rowing and Canoe Racing. Grab a bite at Podium Cafe overlooking the lake or take your own picnic.

St Andrew's Anglican Church

A must see is this historic kauri church. Built in 1881. There are stained-glass windows in the church commemorating Cambridge's Historical connection with Le Quesnoy, in France and a French Garden.

Trash 'n' Treasure

On the second Sunday of the month. Organised by the Cambridge Lion's Club. Stallholders sell a wide variety of goods from handmade items, produce, plants, pre-loved products and collectibles. 8am-1pm. Victoria and Duke Streets, Cambridge.
